
Join Us!

Walk, trot, canter—tölt and pace!

Icelandic horses may be four- or five-gaited. They can walk, trot and canter just like other horses, but they also have two additional gaits unique to the breed. The tölt is an extremely smooth four-beat gait that makes Icelandics ideal riding and trail horses. The flying pace, the fifth gait of some Icelandic horses, is a fast lateral racing gait at which the horse can move at speeds approaching 30 miles per hour—exciting to ride or to watch. Once you have ridden the tölt, you'll be hooked!

About the Icelandic Horse

Icelandic horses originated in Iceland and they are the purest breed in the world. They are usually 13 to 14 hands with a sturdy build and long, thick manes and tails.

They come in a multitude of colors with over 100 variations of shades and patterns. Their breed standard calls for a horse with a personality that is "willing, brave, happy, cheerful, confident,... sensible, easy to ride and handle."

They are wonderful trail horses, but versatile enough to excel in cross country, dressage, endurance and other disciplines too.
